



## **Title I District-School Parental Involvement Policy**

### **PART I. District Expectations**

Paul Robeson Charter School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- The school district will put into operation programs, activities and procedures for the involvement of parents in all of its schools with Title I programs. Those programs, activities and procedures will be planned and operated with meaningful consultation with parents of participating children.
- The school district will work with its schools to ensure that the required school-level parental involvement policies meet the Title I requirements, and include, as a component, a school-parent compact.

## **PART II. DISTRICT/SCHOOL PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT POLICY REQUIRED COMPONENTS**

1. The Paul Robeson Charter School will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its district/school parental involvement plan.

- Hold Annual Title I Meeting
- Obtain parent input through bi-annual school review process, which includes parent and student interviews
- Hold monthly SAC meetings to continue to provide ongoing feedback

2. Paul Robeson Charter School will convene an annual meeting, at a convenient time, to which all parents of participating children shall be invited and encouraged to attend, to inform parents of their school's participation under this part and to explain the requirements of this part, and the right of the parents to be involved; this meeting will be held at the school (643 Indiana Ave) at 6:30PM on September 29, 2015.

3. Paul Robeson Charter School will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide, with funds provided under this part, transportation, child care, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement; meetings will be held during a time when most parents are available, children are welcome. School administration will conduct home visits for families that need additional support.

4. Paul Robeson Charter School will provide the following necessary coordination, technical assistance, and other support to assist Title I schools in planning and implementing effective parental involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance:

- Title I trainings and program support.

5. Paul Robeson Charter School will build the schools' and parents' capacity for strong parental involvement, in order to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, through the following activities specifically described below:

A. The school/district will, with the assistance of its Title I schools, provide assistance to parents of children served by the school district or school, as appropriate, in understanding topics such as the following, by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph --

- The state's academic content standards,
- The state's student academic achievement standards,
- The state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
- The requirements of Title I

- How to monitor their child's progress, and
- How to work with educators

Paul Robeson Charter School will provide parents of participating children, if requested by parents, opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to education of their children, and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practically possible.

B. The school/district will, with the assistance of its Title I schools, provide materials and training to help parents to work with their children to improve their children's achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by hosting math night, literacy night and data dinners.

C. The school/district will, with the assistance of its Title I schools and parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals, and other staff, in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners. In the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by hosting an Annual Title I meeting, school-wide plan review, bi-annual interviews with parent interviews, participating in Parent Advisory Council meetings, and conducting an annual parent survey.

D. The school/district will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities with Head Start, Reading First, Early Reading First, Even Start, the Home Instruction Programs for Preschool Youngsters, the Parents as Teachers Program, and public preschool and other programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children, by partnering with all schools that enroll students at PRCS.

E. The school/district will take the following actions to ensure that Title I information related to the school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities, is sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand, specifically Spanish.

6. Paul Robeson Charter School will coordinate and integrate parental involvement strategies under Title I with parental involvement strategies under the following programs IDEA and homebound instruction.

7. Paul Robeson Charter School will take the following actions to conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parental involvement policy in improving the quality of its Title I schools. The evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in parental involvement activities (with particular attention to parents who are economically disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic minority background). The school district will use the findings of the evaluation about its parental involvement policy and activities to design strategies for more effective parental involvement, and to revise if necessary (and with the involvement of parents) its parental involvement policies.

The evaluation will be conducted through our bi-annual review process including parent interviews. The School Parent Council will be asked to serve as the focus group to conduct the annual school-wide program review during their Spring meetings.

8. Paul Robeson Charter School will take the following actions to involve parents in the process of school review and improvement:

- a) Include parents in the bi-annual review process
- b) Parent survey and
- c) Focus group feedback.

9. If the schoolwide program plan is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, submit any parent comments on the plan when the school makes the plan available to the local education agency. The parents can submit comments/requests to Danielle South.

### **PART III. SHARED RESPONSIBILITIES FOR HIGH STUDENT ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT**
